We have reviewed the subject site plan request and offer the following observations:

Existing Conditions

The property is currently vacant and zoned C-1. The property consists of Lots 23, 24, 25-A and 27-A Square K Suburban Park subdivision. The property is 15,419 square feet with 3388 square feet of concrete-asphalt paving and 12,031 square feet of grass. The property has commercial sites to the north (Friedrich's Street side), apartments to the east (Whitney Avenue side), Hawkins Street to the south and Stumpf Blvd. to the west. The site has access from Hawkins Street to the south and Stumpf Blvd. to the west.

Proposed Site Plan

The submitted site plan proposes to turn the site into a 24 hour automated car wash where the vehicle remains stationary. The site will also include vacuuming stations, lighting, fencing and landscaping. The existing concrete-asphalt pads will be removed and the site will be paved, except for where the landscaping is to be planted. The landscaping will encompass the property except where drive entrances-exits are located at Stumpf Blvd. and Hawkins Street. A large landscaping island next to the car wash building will be planted as well. An enclosed refuse site as well as a small courtyard will be located within the property on the north side.

Proposed Re-subdivision

It is proposed to resubdivide the properties into Lot C1-A. The new lot will have an area of 15,419 square feet. The four lots will be combined into one larger lot to place the new business uses on one lot. The existing lots lines which run through buildings are eliminated.

Comments

According to the City of Gretna's zoning map, the lots are zoned C-1. There is no minimum lot size in a C-1 district for non-residential use.

According to the City of Gretna's Code of Ordinances, the front yard requirement for C-1 is 20 feet. There is no requirement for a side or rear yard. The new building meets the requirements.

The building will be constructed of cinder blocks and house a stationary car wash.

The Class A planting, Class B plantings and parking configuration shown on the plan meet the planting requirements for the site.

The Class A trees that are proposed along Stumpf Blvd may be a problem with the power lines, crepe myrtles may be used instead. Palm trees were discussed but they are not considered a Class A planting.

The facility must connect to the city water supply and storm sewer. While no DEQ discharge permit is required, the owner must meet the city's oil water separator requirements.

The owner must adhere to the MS4 requirements for runoff-discharges. Please see the City of Gretna's Storm water Management Program and the MS4 permit. Drainage Calculations are required.

The entire site must be above the Advisory Base Flood Elevation or 3' above street crown. At a minimum, the equipment room must meet this requirement.

The fence abutting the residence in the rear of the site must be 8'. This 8' requirement can be met by installing an 8' fence or by constructing a 2' chain wall with a 6' fence on top of it.

The resubdivision of the lots is requested to convert the four lots into one for new business purposes. The resubdivision meets the requirements set forth in the zoning ordinance and is recommended for approval.



The planning and zoning official/site plan review committee will advise the applicant on changes required for compliance with the zoning ordinance. The applicant shall make all necessary changes to the site plans to receive final approval. The staff level recommendations shall be forwarded to the city council for final approval. Once the required changes have been made, and the request has been approved, the applicant will submit one original and one copy to be stamped for approval. The revised plans will receive stamped approval from the planning and zoning official. The copy of the approved and stamped site plans will remain on file with the city. The applicant will take the original set of approved and stamped plans to be recorded with the planning and zoning official.

WHEREAS, the City of Gretna City Council agrees to accept ownership of whatever rights the State of Louisiana, through the Department of Transportation and Development (Department), may own, with the exception of any and all mineral rights, in and to the following described property and agrees to accept all future rights, obligations and liabilities, including, but not limited to, all future operation, maintenance, and repairs associated therewith, for its operation and maintenance as a city street, subject to the conditions stated herein below:

<u>Segment 1</u> – The portion of state route LA 466 from its intersection with state route LA 18 (known as Lafayette Street) proceeding northeast as 5th Street and then continuing east as Kepler Street a total of approximately 0.83 mile to its intersection with state route LA 23 (known as Franklin Avenue), inclusive of the traffic signal at the intersection of state route LA 466 (known as 5th Street / Kepler Street) with the local road known as Stumpf Boulevard, inclusive of all rights and responsibilities of DOTD in connection with the New Orleans & Gulf Coast railroad crossing located approximately 0.14 mile west of state route LA 23 southbound (known as Franklin Avenue) and identified as DOT # 855604S.

<u>Segment 2</u> – The portion of state route LA 23 from its intersection with the state route US 90 Business (known as the Westbank Expressway) north service road proceeding northwest as Stumpf Boulevard and then continuing north as Franklin Avenue a total of approximately 0.97 mile to its intersection with state route LA 428 (known as Burmaster Street), inclusive of the traffic signals at the intersection of state route LA 23 (known as Stumpf Boulevard) and state route LA 23 (known as Franklin Avenue), and at the intersection of state route LA 23 (known as Franklin Avenue) with state route LA 466 (known as Kepler Street).

CONDITION I:

<u>Segment 1</u> – Repairs will not be provided to the portion of state route LA 466 (known as 5^{th} Street / Kepler Street) to be transferred to the City of Gretna, but improvements will be made as stated in Condition III using the road transfer credits provided in Condition II herein below.

<u>Segment 2</u> - Provide repairs to include patching, clean, reseal joints and cracks in the jointed Portland-cement concrete pavement, and striping the repaired pavement for the portion of state route LA 23 (known as Stumpf Boulevard / Franklin Avenue) to be transferred to the City of Gretna.

<u>Segment 3</u> – Provide repairs to include patching, clean, reseal joints and cracks in the jointed Portland-cement concrete pavement, and striping the repaired pavement for the portion of state route LA 428 (known as Franklin Avenue) to be transferred to the City of Gretna.

<u>Segment 4</u> - Provide repairs to include patching, clean, reseal joints and cracks in the jointed Portland-cement concrete pavement, and striping the repaired pavement for the portion of state route LA 428 (known as Burmaster Street) to be transferred to the City of Gretna.

CONDITION II:

<u>Segments 1 and 2</u> - Provide \$2,048,390.48 in road transfer credit for the portion of state route LA 466 and LA 23 to be transferred to the City of Gretna to be applied to the improvements in Conditions III with any remaining balance of the road transfer credit being applied, at DOTD's sole discretion, towards the City's share of funding under a program of the Department affecting the City.

<u>Segments 3 and 4</u> – Upon the execution of a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement between the Department and the City of New Orleans for the transfer of the portion of state route LA 428 from the Jefferson Parish Line proceeding north as Nunez Street and then continuing northeast as Verret Street a total of approximately 0.42 mile to its junction with the local road known as Lamarque Street, provide \$875,366.90 in road transfer credit for the portions of state route LA 428 to be transferred to the City of Gretna to be applied to the improvements in Conditions III with any remaining balance of the road transfer credit being applied, at DOTD's sole discretion, towards the City's share of funding under a program of the Department affecting the City.

CONDITION III: Provide improvements to a portion of state route LA 466 (known as 5th Street) as mutually agreed to by the Department and the City of Gretna, not to exceed the road transfer credit provided in Condition II. If the cost exceeds the road transfer credit provided in Conditional funding will be the responsibility of the City of Gretna City Council.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the City of Gretna shall accept ownership of whatever rights the Department may own in and to the aforesaid described property as a binding agreement between the Department and the City of Gretna City Council, provided the Department shall comply with the relevant condition(s) stated herein. Portions of the aforesaid described property may be transferred to the City of Gretna in its current condition prior to satisfaction of the relevant condition(s) stated herein, if mutually agreed in writing to be in the best interest of the parties. Such transfer shall not relieve DOTD of responsibility to comply with the relevant condition(s) stated herein above.



Hancock Street Canal Improvements

The Hancock Street Canal Drainage Improvements have been completed. The small drainage pipes alongside Hancock are being installed.

Gretna City Hall Electrical Upgrades

All the new electrical installation has been completed. The final payment-change order has been submitted.

Gretna Police Department Paving Project

The project is complete. The final payment-change order is being prepared for submission.

Gretna Wastewater Treatment Plant Digester Roof Removal and Sludge Disposal

The notice to proceed was issued February 13, 2017. The project time is 60 calendar days.

Precipitator #2 Rehabilitation, replacing the metal basin with fiberglass

Replacing the metal basin with a fiberglass basin. All bid documents and plans have been advertised. The new bid date advertisement is February 15 and Bid Due date is March 14. A pre-bid meeting will be held on Thursday, March 2, 2017 at the Gretna Utilities Department at 10 am. The project time is 180 calendar days.

Stumpf Boulevard Sewer Force Main

Installation of over 2,500 feet of high-density polyethylene pipe by use of horizontal directional drilling, removal of asphalt and concrete paving. All bid documents and plans have been advertised. The new bid date advertisement is February 15 and Bid Due date is March 15. The project time is 120 calendar days.

Jefferson Parish MS4 Permit 2015-2016

The Gretna portion of the Jefferson Parish MS4 Permit is completed and sent to DEI for inclusion in Jefferson Parish's MS4 document. The MS4 Gretna Self-Assessment modules are complete & have been turned in LADEQ.

4th Street Extension

Ribbon cutting to kick off construction is March 8, 2017. 15% Plans and Specifications for the Governor Hall Connection may be started in March of 2014.

Gretna Bike Path

The final comments from LADOTD have been completed including, the traffic study. We are now awaiting any final comments from DOTD.

Stumpf Blvd. at West Bank Expressway Road Failure-Drainage Project

Cost estimates to close in the canal and divert a portion of the flow directly to Whitney Canal via Dupas Street, Friedrichs Road or Hawkins Street are being are being prepared. Currently the city is in litigation with Command Construction and a permanent solution (filling in the canal with box culverts) will be presented at the March Council Meeting.

Downtown Gretna Lighting

Meetings have been held with the Mayor and Councilman Hinyub to discuss phasing in the new lighting along Huey P. Long Avenue. The lighting project will take place in 3 phases. Phase 1 will use the previously bought light poles and Luminaires from 6th Street to Third St. The farmers market area may require a different type off lighting i.e. canopy lights but they will be in the same spirit as the pre-bought lighting. Phase 2 will be between 3rd Street and First Street. We will use the pre-bought lighting where possible but additional arched lighting may be required sue to the width of the street in this area. The arched lighting will be in the same spirit as the pre-bought lighting. The plan is to roll this lighting work into the Downtown Drainage Project when funding becomes available. This lighting will be a separate pay item so as not to intermingle state funding for the Downtown Drainage. The final phase will be from 11th Street to the West Bank Expressway.

Gretna Kiosks at City Hall

Costs to design the Kiosk installation have been submitted to H3HC. Total project costs are in the process of being submitted to the City.

25th Street Canal Project Grant Writing-Engineering Design Request for Proposals

Request for Proposals to create grant applications and engineering design have been advertised and are due on March 8, 2017.


